The Empire Swine Youth Scholarship Contest was held August 27th – 30th in Syracuse, New York at The Great New York State Fair. 32 youth and their families traveled from across the state to exhibit their best hogs and try their hand at the knowledge events prepared for them as a part of the contest, the event grew 13 exhibitors from last year. Volunteers put together skillathon, interview, knowledge review, records, livestock judging, poster, presentation, scavenger hunt contests and more. The industry rallied behind these contests and their participants to donate over \$9,000 in scholarship monies, this is up \$3,000 from 2016. The competition was fierce and there was a new found passion, challenge, and enthusiasm in the barn.
